

DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST - SERIES II — During his trial at Nuremberg in 1947, the prosecutor asked Otto Ohlendorf (commander of Einsatzgruppe D) why children were massacred: "Will you explain to the tribunal what conceivable threat to the security of the Wehrmacht a child constituted, in your judgment?" Ohlendorf answered: "According to orders, they were to be killed just like their parents. I did not have to determine the danger but the order said that all Jews including the children were considered to constitute a danger for the security of this area." He further explained: "I believe that it is very simple to explain if one starts from the fact that this order did not only try to achieve a temporary security but also a permanent security, for the children were people who would grow up and, surely being the children of parents who had been killed, would constitute a danger no smaller than that of the parents."
