DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST FAILED IN DENMARK — During the summer of 1943, German countermeasures failed to slow Danish sabotage. When the Germans threatened to take hostages and use terror to control the population, a general strike began. Starting in the provinces, it spread throughout Denmark. On August 28th, the Germans demanded that the Danish Government take repressive steps to end the unrest. When the ultimatum was rejected, the Nazis took control. The Government ceased to exist.
