

DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST - SERIES II — After the German capitulation, the Nazi war on the Jews was over. The remnants of the Jewish population emerged from behind the barbed wire of the concentration camps, "a mass of homeless and uprooted people, robbed of all material goods, undernourished and undermined in health." What they experienced or witnessed, the nightmares of horrors, would haunt them for the rest of their lives. "The survivors were mostly without families, and without loyalties to their native countries, but with a strengthened attachment to their own people and its aspirations — especially the hope to establish a Jewish State in Palestine." In the above photo aid, liberated inmates of the Buchenwald concentration camp, injured and emaciated, are looking through the barbed wire enclosing the area. Many mature prisoners at Buchenwald looked like youths because of their emaciation.
