



DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST - SERIES II — Germany attacked Poland on September 1, 1939, and World War II started. The German government exercised some restraint towards German, Austrian, and Czechoslovakian Jews before the war began, but under wartime conditions, restraint was no longer considered. Within three weeks the Germans overran Poland and indiscriminately slaughtered thousands of Polish citizens. The countries' 3,250,000 Jewish citizens were now in great danger. Reichsfuhrer-S.S. Heinrich Himmler ordered all Jews and "hostile elements among the Polish population" to be "resettled." They were to be transported to the General Government region and dumped into
