JEWS HEED CALL TO ACTION

From the President

Those who attended our first Installation Banquet at the Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel on September 23, undoubtedly agreed that the affair was a success from all angles. Much of the credit should be given to the two hard-working Chairmen of the Banquet Committee, decorations headed by Mrs. Bernard H. Arnold, and to Miss Eva R. Obeler in charge of the usherettes.

After the invocation by Rabbi Jacob Sonderling, and having partaken of a sumptuous dinner, the Chairman introduced screen actor and member of the State Assembly, Albert Dekker, our toastmaster, a well-known liberal in our community. Effectively driving home the importance of unity and co-operation as vital to Jews, Mr. Dekker clarified the essential nature of the Zionist aim.

Judge Irvin Stalmaster, chairman of the Jewish Centers Association, in installing officers, praised the members and officers of the organization for their achievements. His installation ceremony of the officers of the Youth Group was especially significant as he exhorted them to become the fighters and leaders of the future.

I salute the members of our Youth Group and its officers, Martin Salvin, President, Cy Dinkin, Vice-President, Michael Simon, Secretary, and Larry Weisman, Treasurer. The installation was dignified and inspiring, and will be remembered for years to come.

Probably the most striking feature was Mr. Dekker's scintillating wit and ad-libbing. His introductions of the entertainers were made with humor and good taste. Our thanks are extended to Miss Marcia Solomon for her Palestinian folk songs, to Isidore Epstein, a member of our Executive Committee, who rendered Russian numbers, and to Pietro Gentile, whose rich baritone voice held the audience spellbound.

A novel event was the presentation of fresh fruits from the Succoth decorations to each new member. In my opinion this type of banquet should serve as a precedent for future annual installations.

A huge crowd, estimated at more than 70,000 persons—Jews and non Jews—jammed New York's gigantic Madison Square Garden and packed the streets outside to cheer Dr. Abba Hillel Silver's call to mobilization in the battle for Palestine as a Jewish state. Equal acclaim was given to Governor Dewey's address.

Mayor La Guardia, Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Israel Goldstein made militant addresses in the spirit of the rallying cry sounded by Dr. Silver who declared that, "from here on, every Jew becomes a soldier in the Army of Jewish Liberation!" It was the most militant demonstration in history.

Stirring climax of the meeting came when the entire audience, led by the chairman, Henry Monsky, co-chairman of the Interim Committee of the American Jewish Conference, rose as one and pledged themselves "as Jews and American citizens" to "fight back relentlessly until the legitimate rights of the Jewish people are recognized—until Palestine is opened wide to free Jewish immigration and a Jewish State is re-established." Disclose Hitler-Mufti Telegrams

New York — An exchange of telegrams between Adolph Hitler and the notorious ex-Mufti of Jerusalem, Amin el Husseini, discovered among the secret diplomatic correspondence of the Fuehrer, was disclosed today by the American Zionist Emergency Council.

The ex-Mufti's telegram, sent at the time when Field Marshal Rommel's victories threatened the entire Middle East, congratulated Hitler "on the occasion of the Axis victory in North Africa," and declared that "the Arab people will further continue to fight on your side against the common enemy up to ultimate victory."

Fuehrer Grateful

Hitler's message of thanks was transmitted to Amin el Husseini by German Staatsminister Dr. Meissner, and reads as follows: "The Fuehrer ordered me to transmit to your Eminence his heartiest thanks for your friendly congratulations of which the Fuehrer took notice with satisfaction."

The exchange of telegrams was found in Germany filed under the heading, "Volume 13, Letters and Telegrams From Foreign Heads of State." Amin el Husseini's telegram to Hitler, dated on July 4, 1942, reads:

"Allow me, Fuehrer, to express to you the sincere joy of the Arabian people and my best wishes on the occasion of the Axis victory in North Africa. These successes were crowned by the solemn declarations of the German and Italian Governments, in which the sovereignty and independence of Egypt were recognized and assured. These wise policies of the Axis powers, which guided the German-Italian armies from victory to victory, will produce a very good echo not only in Egypt but also in all the other Arab lands and in the entire Orient, for they offer the best proof of the noble aims of the Axis governments and assure the other Arab lands of their liberty and independence. The Arab people will further continue to fight on your side against the common enemy up to ultimate victory."

Timely Revelation

In releasing the text of the ex-Mufti's telegram, the American Zionist Emergency Council stated: "This revelation is most timely, in view of the Arab cam-Continued on page 4

We must not let Palestine be sacrificed on the altar of British appearsement.

We must never let Attlee forget that his party adopted a resolution last May which demanded that Palestine's doors be opened to unrestricted Jewish immigration so that Jews may, in time, establish a majority status.

We must not let the British forget that twenty-eight years have passed since their government made its pledge to the Jews, and to the world, that the foundation of a Jewish Commonwealth would be established.

We must make Christendom realize that the British White Paper is an implacable demand that Jews be murdered, that they be enslaved, that they starve rather than be permitted to return to their ancient homeland.

We must clearly see the sheer hypocrisy of a government which sheds the blood of its people in defense of a sacred principle and then adopts the iniquitous slave policies of its malevolent enemies.

We must realize that, although VE Day meant liberation for all peoples subjected by the Nazis, Jews, however, are compelled to remain stateless and be condemned to thralldom, and that British weakness and opportunism are largely responsible for this harrowing signation.

We must never forget, in this struggle, the wise council of Menahem Ussishkin who declared: "When Eretz Israel went up in flames, the Jewish people went into Diaspora; when Diaspora goes up in flame, the Jewish people must return to Eretz Israel." Just a few months have passed since Germany capitulated and Jews who have escaped the unimaginable horrors of concentration camps are still, thanks to the British, living in

PALESTINE

Trade Delegation Success

London (ZOA)—Jewish Palestine's Trade delegation to this country comprised of representatives of organizations and individual firms revealed here that its mission "met with considerable success."

The delegation found many shortages in Britain, which preclude export to Palestine, but has also succeeded in clearing up other difficulties which had arisen owing to insufficient contact. The delegation hoped that now it will be possible to import many things independent of the Mid East Supply Center, because only articles of which there is still a shortage everywhere remain under control of the Mid East Supply Center.

The delegation has recommended the establishment of a permanent office in Britain to continue the work of the mission.

The delegation also submitted a memorandum to the British government to treat Palestine's industries on a par with its own and to permit Palestine to conclude reciprocal trade agreements with a "most favored nation" clause. This would stop the prewar practice of dumping which now constitutes the most serious potential threat to Palestine in dustry.

The memorandum requests that quotas for raw materials and semi-manufactured goods be allocated to Palestine's industry in accordance with the needs of the country. Pointing to the importance of a balanced economy in Palestine, attention is drawn to the reconversion of Palestine's industry to peacetime production, and its need to employ a large number of the 30,000 Jewish volunteers when they are demobilized, and a large number of Jews from Europe.

PALESTINE ISSUES

Among those important personalities who last month visited Los Angeles was Congressman Emanuel Cellar, a staunch Zionist, who is touring the country to arouse public opinion against the White Paper and Senator Ralph Owen Brewster of Maine, who spoke before large Christian and Jewish groups pleading for their help for Palestine. In an exclusive statement to the Hollywood Zionist Congressman Emanuel Cellar stated: "For over 40 years Zionists have mistaken philanthropy for political action. Now is the time to fight for the cause of a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine, because we will achieve our aim only by fighting for itas all worthwhile things are obtained that way.'

In a press conference Senator Brewster said:

"President Truman has asked Prime Minister Attlee to permit 100,000 Jews from Germany to migrate at once to the Jewish homeland. But the British have agreed only to allow 1500 a month—a mere trickle.

"The British should not be given a \$5,000,000,000 loan until they keep their commitments to us in this matter. Under the Coolidge convention of 1925 it was agreed to permit unrestricted Jewish emigration to Palestine.

"The British are holding to the subsequent white paper of 1939 which denied the promises of the Balfour declaration," he said.

"The British claim," Sen. Brewster continued, "that they do not allow this because of Arab pressure against it. This is not their real reason. Most of the Arab agitation is synthetic and it is pretty clear how it is stimulated. The British want to appear to be put into the position of championing Arab interests, thus they hope to have the support of the 35,000,000 Moslems in the Near East, to say nothing of political advantages in India.

"Thus you see the British are using the Hitler technique of making the Jews a red herring."

Palestine Year Book Ready

The publication of a *Palestine Year Book*, containing a survey of the past year's events in the Jewish National Homeland, and in the Zionist movement in this country and abroad, was recently announced by Dr. Israel Goldstein, president of the Z. O. A.

The volume is edited by Sophie A. Udin, librarian of the Zionist Library and Archives. It comprises 15 sections which embrace all major aspects regarding Palestine's upbuilding and the growth of the Zionist movement. There is a foreword by Dr. Israel Goldstein, and an introduction by Judge Louis E. Levinthal, chairman of the publication committee of the Z. O. A.

\$500,000 Fund Launched

J.

CIO HEAD WARNS ATTLEE ON WHITE PAPER

New York, N. Y .- Declaring that he spoke for the entire membership of the Congress of Industrial Organizations, Philip Murray, President of the CIO cabled Prime Minister Clement Attlee of Great Britain a sharp protest against reports that the British Cabinet will continue the Palestine White Paper.

Text of the cable follows:

"Reports that British Cabinet favors con-tinuation of Palestine White Paper policy with slight modification are causing consternation here stop American Labor which to-gether with British labor has repeatedly endorsed Jewish aspirations in Palestine cannot believe that solemn pledges to Jewish people will now be forgotten. If White Paper is to continue, American public opinion is certain to react vigorously. It is bound to have harmful effect on Anglo-American relations. Speaking for entire membership of Congress of Industrial Organizations I respectfully urge you to avert this cruel blow to the Jewish people and to bring about fulfillment of the promise of unrestricted Jewish immigration into Pales-

In making public the text of the cable, Mr. Murray, who is honorary chairman of the American Jewish Trade Union Committee for Palestine, pointed out that the 1944 Convention of the CIO unanimously adopted a resolution calling for abrogation of the White Paper, unrestricted Jewish immigration into Palestine, and its ultimate reconstitution as a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth.

"American Firster"

Rabbi Elmer Berger, anti-Zionist extraordinary, has been generously praised by Gerald K. Smith, "The Cross and the Flag.'

"Rabbi Elmer Berger has been touring the nation urging Jews to be Americans first and Jews second. The B'nai B'rith Messenger, official B'nai B'rith organ in Los Angeles, as well as the Los Angeles Jewish Voice, virtually accused the Rabbi of being a traitor to his people because of his opposition to the Zionist idea. Rabbi Berger seems to be an American Firster. Jews will do well to accept some practical advice from the Rabbi."
