God's Plan for the Jews Today

G. P. RAUD

SCATTERED among all the nations of the earth and yet distinct from every nation, God's ancient people are a subject of peculiar interest to every reader of the Bible. To be accurate and complete, any presentation of the Jewish subject should give a large place to what God is doing with the Jew in this present day of grace.

The Apostle Paul's Example

Paul, if any one, was qualified to speak on Jewish prophecy. Yet notice that the burden of his heart was the salvation of his people. He might have lectured on the Jews as few in these days can, but far more vital to him than the dissemination of prophetic knowledge was the need of their souls and the work of winning them to Christ. He saw the Jews, not merely as subjects of prophecy, but as lost souls who ought to hear the gospel. He labored to save them, and through him many Jews came to Christ. Millions of Jews in the world are without the Saviour; unless they hear of forgiveness of sins through His blood, they are hopelessly lost.

Let Us Beware of Hardened Hearts

To over-emphasize prophecy can produce hardness of heart. Some Christians have become avid seekers of prophetic information but do nothing, or next to nothing, for the salvation of precious Jewish souls. It is dangerous to have knowledge without love.

There is a Jewish Remnant

We dare not neglect to evangelize the Jews. In this dispensation there is a remnant from Israel which is to be saved through the grace of God. Not all Jews are hardened. Through the preaching of the gospel in this present age God brings out from among the Jews this remnant of those who accept Jesus Christ. He is not now occupied with the Jews nationally. Now He offers to them individually His saving grace that they might become members of the church of Christ, forming with redeemed Gentiles "one new man in Christ Jesus" (Eph. 2:15).

Jews are Being Saved

For many years God has been using the National Jewish Missions to bring lost Jews to Christ. Jews in Europe and Jews in America today are rejoicing in salvation because God brought the mission into being. We thank Him for this glorious privilege of adding saved Jewish souls to the church of Christ; and with eyes fixed on Him we labor on in the task of Jewish evangelization. Conscious of Debt

We print below the testimony of Mr. Joseph Brull, our worker among the Jews in Marseille. Both Mr. and Mrs. Brull (Mrs. Brull's testimony was given in last month's issue of Jew and Palestine News) have a sense of indebtedness to God for His mercy toward them; they are eager to bring their fellow Jews the gospel of Christ. Please pray for them.

I was born in Stanislaw, Poland, which is today a part of Russia. I first studied in Lemberg and afterwards in Vienna. I remained in Vienna until the outbreak of the war, but was compelled by Hitler to leave all my possessions and flee

with my wife and child to France; I have been in France since 1939.

Tragic as these events have been for me and my family (my son, my hope, was taken from me), the end of them has been full of blessing. I and my wife have been brought to true peace. Fleeing from the Gestapo, we found the truth in Christ. We have determined, in order to show our great thankfulness to God, to spread His truth among our poor kinsmen according to the flesh.

I now place at the disposal of the Saviour my knowledge of Hebrew, Yiddish, German, Polish, French and English; and I also give Him the love of my heart for my poor people with whom I have suffered from my youth up. I know the Jewish sorrow, and have passed through all the phases of our religion from Orthodoxy to Zionism.

As long as Israel refuses the Lord, Israel will suffer; in heaven there will be mourning, and on earth there will be chaos. The people must be converted; they must be reconciled with the Father in heaven who waits with open arms to receive them.

My goal is to serve God. There is need for literature: booklets, tracts, periodicals, and books relating to conversion. There is need for many copies of the Word of God.


A Jewess at a Brooklyn Street Meeting

Two Thousand Jews in Rumania Discuss the Palestine Problem

AST Saturday the Jews here called a large assembly to discuss the subject, "How can the Palestine problem be solved?" I attended this gathering of two thousand Jews in order to witness for Christ.

I let all the speakers finish, and then I succeeded in getting an opportunity to speak. I said to the assembled Jews, "You go to springs which have no water. You look for help to kings and princes and forget the Word of God: 'The Lord thy God will raise up unto thee a Prophet from the midst of thee, of thy brethren, like unto me; unto him ye shall hearken."

I went on to tell them that this One of whom the Scripture speaks is the Messiah, Jesus Christ; I made it clear that Messiah was offered for their sins and for mine upon the hill of Golgotha. "Over the head

of the crucified Messiah," I said, "the words of Jesus of Nazareth, the king of the Jews, were written in three languages. These words are eternally true! You Jews, who are of my own nation, hear today that you will only obtain the land of your fathers through Jesus Christ, the King of the land."

I further told these assembled Jews, "All your endeavors are in vain. Only Jesus Christ can solve your problems. Without Him the Jewish nation will never have the land; and without Him the Jewish nation can find no peace with God."

The whole company of Jews listened to my witness of Christ. Please pray for me and help me as I bring the gospel to my people.

- 5. Ask God that the Thursday school for Jewish children now held in Mrs. Brull's home may lead to the salvation, not only of the children, but also the parents.
- 6. Remember Mr. Schnapp's witness among the better class Jews in Rumania. God is greatly using Mr. Schnapp among his own people.
- 7. Pray that those of God's children who as yet do not have warm hearts for the salvation of Jews may quickly be awakened to Jewish need. It may soon be too late.
- 8. Thank God for every worker of the National Jewish Missions. Pray that many more faithful men and women may join them in the great task of Jewish evangelization.
- 9. Pray that every European government including Russia may give full permission to reach Jews for Christ. Pray that anti-Semitism may never gain power in America.

PALESTINE: News of the Yishuv*

Luftwaffe files now reveal that the ex-Mufti urged the bombing of Jerusalem and Tel-Aviv by Germany. Although Germany turned the suggestion down, they gave the matter consideration. Palestine was not bombed; and the growth of the Yishuv still aggravates Arab resentment.

Trouble

The most serious recent news from Palestine is the bombing of oil installations at Haifa. It may take years for the country to recover from the loss of oil and equipment. The Palestine Government has decided that the population, preferably the Jewish community, pay for the damage which amounts to at least one million dollars.

The Irgun Zvai Leumi, an underground movement using extreme measures, declares that although its supplies are not unlimited it has never yet cancelled operations because of lack of weapons. It will continue to strike whenever and wherever possible.

Progress

Of a more constructive nature is the information that during the year 5706 (1946) the Yishuv published 947 books in Hebrew. Hebrew has taken great hold upon the Yishuv. There are today in Palestine ten daily Hebrew newspapers, all of which are printed in Tel-Aviv. Hebrew is the only medium of instruction in the public school system of Palestine.

Setback

And of course the Yishuv has some setbacks. Palestine, with the rest of our post-war world, has a housing shortage problem. Money is scarce to purchase available materials; the materials available are not sufficient to meet the need; and there are not enough men to do the building.

Looking to America

Palestine Jewry looks for the presence in its midst of many American Jews. There are today about seventy American Jews studying in the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. A recent gift of fifty thousand dollars to the University from a New York fund is expected to stimulate the desire of more young American Jews to study in Palestine. This large sum of money, providing as it does for scholarships for American Jews, will greatly facilitate such study.

Religious Schisms

A Jew who had the temerity to enter the area of the Dome of the Rock sacred to the Moslems was beaten to death recently by a Moslem crowd. The last such incident took place eighteen years ago when Moslems smashed ritual articles at the Wailing Wall. During the Easter celebrations, religious differences in the Holy City were most apparent. Roman Catholic

A White-haired Jew Buys a New Testament

It was evening as I entered the city playground in a Jewish section of Brooklyn. I handed a few tracts to some of the men sitting around, and I was encouraged by the way many held out their hands for them. One man, who did not look Jewish, took a tract; a few minutes later I saw him conversing with another who was obviously Jewish. I went back to talk with these two men, and found them both to be Jews. They asked a couple of questions about the tract; and then one of them, who could not understand much English, walked away.

I saw my opportunity and sat down beside the white-haired Jew who remained. I learned that he came from Austria in 1919, and that during some of his schooldays he had lived in Czechoslovakia. His playmates, Roman Catholic children, had persecuted him and accused the Jews of crucifying Christ. I showed this European Jew from the Scriptures that it was the Roman soldiers who actually did the deed, but that the Jews provoked it.

This elderly Jew readily admitted that sin is at the root of Israel's present affliction, and confessed his own sin of prayerlessness. He seemed to long for assurance, and there were tears in his eyes as I read from the prophet Isaiah, "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all."

I testified how the burden of sin disappeared from my heart when I put my trust in the blood of Christ, and before I left him this Jew asked to buy from me a copy of the New Testament. Pray that God will remove the veil from this Jewish heart as he reads the Word of God.
