OGUNQUIT-BY-THE-SEA.

A charming sea shore and country resort. Located 79 miles from Boston; 36 miles from Portland; 16 miles from Portsmouth, N. H., on Route No. 1; 5 miles from Wells Beach Station, Western Division of Boston and Maine R. R. Taxis meet all trains. Bus terminal in the village.

Ogunquit is a wonderland of marine and woodland scenery. The beach is one of the finest on the coast, more than three miles long, perfectly safe and ideal for bathing.

The river which runs parallel with the beach and separated from it by sand dunes affords excellent boating and bathing. For bathing it is warmer than the surf.

Fishing from the river bridge for flounders and fishing from the rocks for cunners, cod or pollock is a popular sport.

Boats go out daily for deep sea fishing. Giant tunas weighing several hundred pounds are caught off shore.

The Marginal Way is a delightful walk along the rocky shore where one may enjoy the glorious beauty of the sea, quiet walks thro' pine woods, or horse back riding over the country and sea side trails and auto trips on the many lovely woodland and ocean drive ways are enjoyable features.

Ogunquit's Golf Course, the Cliff Country Club, is located 1 1-2 miles from the Chapman House. Guests are eligible to play golf or tennis on payment of the moderate fee.

Ogunquit has four churches, Methodist, Baptist, Episcopal and Catholic, a bank, public library, stores, movie theatre and summer Play House, with New York productions weekly, gift shops and tea rooms, dancing if one wishes, quiet and relaxation if one prefers it.

CHAPMAN HOUSE, situated on the winding Shore Road, Route No. 1 A near Sandy Cove an ideal place for bathing. From its broad west piazzas an unobstructed country view is obtained, a living picture of green fields, pine clad woods and Mt. Agamenticus in the distance. The sunsets seen from here are gorgeous. Spacious grounds where one may enjoy outdoor sports, croquet, quoits and other games or lounge under a sun shade.

A platform on the east where one may get the full benefit of the morning sun and enjoy the rock gardens and ledges.

The house is five minutes walk from the ocean, beach and Marginal Way.

The dining room is cool and attractive, with eleven tables seating four. The Chapman House is noted for its home cooking. Fresh vegetables and berries served in abundance from our own gardens.

Ogunquit sea food is a special feature.

There are twenty guest rooms, large and airy, immaculately clean, excellent beds. Family rooms with or without private bath.

The Lounge is home like and inviting with large fireplace for comfort and cheer on cool evenings, various tables for bridge and other games. Many comfortable chairs and reading lamps. The fifteen hand braided rugs and family antiques give this room an unusual charm.
