Dear Mr.Schleyer:

I am more than ashamed that we have not answered your various letters in which you have asked us to help you get an affidavit. In spite of our not writing, we have definitely been working but unfortunately with no results.

We did see Mrs. Klee back in the summer

She seemed to be an unreliable person and told us that she
had sent you an affidavit but she could not produce a copy to
show. Our worker talked to her about the \$50 but she insisted
she did not have it as it had been paid to somebody whose name
she would not divulge as a fee for expediting your emigration.

She agreed to attempt to get the money back. She told us at
the same time that she could not secure a supplementary affidavit
to help but that a Mr. S. Steinlaugh living at 251 W. 93 St.

New York had promised to put aside a set sum in your behalf. Our
worker was inclined to disbelieve that story as she did all the
others Mrs. Klee told.

Our worker did contact Mr. Steinlaugh herself and learned he was unable to submit an affidavit. He has his own small business making custom made shirts and his income is small. He has no resources. He promised that he would try to obtain an affidavit but again we have little hopes.

I think we might at this time contact Mrs. Klee once again to see if there is any possibility of getting the \$50. If we meet with any success at all you will hear from us.
