As we were by the dock, cameramen took pictures of all of us standing near the railing. We weren't allowed to leave the ship until in the afternoon. We were met by the Red Cross in the harbor, and then boarded a bus which took us to the station.

At the station we took our train to NEW-YORK CITY.
